Project Description:

Masanafu Child And Family support is a Community Based Organization founded in 2013. It seeks to fight poverty and human degradation, with a special focus on Orphans and Vulnerable Children infected and affected by HIV/AIDS. MCAFS supports OVC through vocational skills training. It supports retention in school of children through an educational support program. To the surrounding community MCAFS carries out socioeconomic strengthening of OVC caregivers, sensitization on child protection, healthcare and psychosocial support to OVC and increasing the communitys awareness on HIV/AIDS prevention.

Work: Working with the social workers in their day today activities. Assist in record keeping Computer training Technical support in the specific areas. Eg. Welding, mechanics, tailoring. Carpentry. Horticulture Etc.

Requirements: Emotionally strong. The volunteer should be ready to interact with marginalized, vulnerable and neglected positive and negative children inside and outside slums and villages. Ability to work with children and youth.

Food: Depending on the accomodation chosen, the volunteer will share and cook

meals with the family or prepare their own meals at the guest house.

Accommodation: Volunteers can stay at UPA Guest house. Possibility to arrange for host family. From UPA Guesthouse/Nansana to Masanafu, it is 7 kms and it costs 12,000 UGX (to and from) by a hired motorcycle (Boda Boda).

Pocket money: None

Insurance: Not provided. Volunteer has to have his/her own insurance.

Fees: 500 EUR one time payment. Pick up from the airport/bus upon arrival in Uganda; orientation/training; accommodation; water; gas/electricity/charcoal; kitchen utensils; admin/communication; evaluation with host project. 500EUR for 1-3 month, 80EUR for each additional month.

Visa: The volunteers must apply for a tourist visa online with this link. <https://www.visas.immigration.gov.uk/>. This should be done a couple of weeks or months before the departure date. It costs 50 USD.

Others: This is a new but very interesting project for volunteers interested in working with vulnerable youth and orphans.

The basis of communication at MCAFS is English though majority of the clients and communities we operate in speak little English and local languages.

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Project Description:

Kampala School for the physically handicapped (KSFPH) is a primary school catering for the educational needs of disabled children. Started in 1968 by a few parents of cerebral palsied children, the school aims at educating, rehabilitating and equipping physically handicapped children for self-reliance and development. The national syllabus including activities like sports, music, dance and drama, spiritual fellowship and education is followed. It also offers vocational training (e.g. in tailoring, screen printing and craft) to children that cannot continue with further education.

Work: Work with the rest of the staff to provide the above to: * Teach * Care and assisting children in and outside classrooms * Train children in vocational subjects, games and sports * Train children in music, dance and drama * Assist in social and physical development of the children through offering occupational and physiotherapy exercises.

Kampala School for the physically handicapped office hours are from 8.00 to 16.30. Volunteers work 5 days a week.

Requirements: Working with physically disabled and special needs children calls for a volunteer ready to be patient, not emotional and prepared to experience irritating situations. However, a volunteer shall carry a very open heart that can accommodate these situations. Having skills in caring for children with special needs or occupational and physiotherapy skills is an advantage. Good communication skills are needed.

Food: Depending on the accommodation chosen, the volunteer will share and cook meals with the family or prepare their own meals at the guest house.

Accommodation: Volunteers can stay at UPA Guest house. Possibility to arrange for host family. Project can be reached by public transport, ca. 45 min to 1 hour, it costs 12000 UGX to and from.

Pocket money: None

Insurance: Not provided. Volunteer has to have his/her own insurance.

Fees: 500 EUR one time payment. Pick up from the airport/bus upon arrival in Uganda; orientation/training; accommodation; water; gas/electricity; kitchen utensils; admin/communication; evaluation with host project. 500EUR for 1-3 months, 80EUR for each additional month.

Visa: A tourist visa must be applied online and it is purchased at the airports entry point. It costs 50 USD for up to three months.

Others: The placement can be an interesting one because it will offer a volunteer the opportunity to assist and support people who are really in need and will highly appreciate. A volunteer should also carry an affectionate heart full of love, care and sympathy for children with special needs.

Note: All volunteers choosing school project should always remember to consider the school holidays in mid-April mid-May, mid-August mid-September and December to early February.

Project Description:

The hospital was started in 2008 in the slum areas of Lubaga, 5km from Kampala due to lack of health services in the area as people had to travel long distances to the public hospitals. It has a capacity of 40 inpatient beds and is registered by the Medical board council of Uganda with a practicing license.

Work: Working with the health Team; Helping on-medical personnel basing on skills possessed by volunteer; Engage in patient home visits; Provide a hand in immunization; Ensuring patient care is maintained; Early childhood growth & development lessons; Represent hospital in seminars and trainings; HIV counseling and testing; HIV sensitization and awareness in schools; Participate and coordinate village outreaches; Registration and assessment of new beneficiaries; Follow up on activities; Administrative and office work.

The volunteers are required to be at the hospital at 08.00 and work will finish at 17.00 from Monday to Friday but community outreaches may be conducted on selected days

The volunteers are required to be at the office at 08.00 and work will finish at 17.00. 8:45 am to 16:45 pm, Monday to Friday and 9:00 am to 1:00 pm on Saturday but subject to changes due to unavoidable circumstances! During reach outs to clients volunteers may work longer hours.

Requirements: Being emotionally strong; motivated; open minded.

We are looking for volunteers with both medical background and other skills.

Food: Depending on the accomodation chosen, the volunteer will share and cook meals with the family or prepare their own meals at the guest house.

Accommodation: Volunteers can stay at UPA Guest house. Possibility to arrange for host family. Distance from UPA Guesthouse to the project is 7 km and it costs about 15000 UGX (to and from) by a hired motorcycle (Boda Boda) or 12000 UGX by public means.

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Project Description:

GOOD MUMMY SCHOOL KOSOVO was founded 2006 in the urban slums of Kosovo valley in Lubyia parish to help support the marginalized slum orphans and vulnerable children in the area. It was due to lack any basic school where the community would send their children to attend and attain basic education. We currently support more than 180 kids at our school- GOOD MUMMY SCHOOL KOSOVO has the kindergarten wing and lower primary.

Work: Activities range from community outreach, administrative work to Kindergarten activities. Volunteers should prepare to assist with one or more of the following: Attend to Day Care center for babies and pupils Support to teach children of the ages 3 years to 6 years in all Early Childhood learning areas and development skills. Volunteers might even do this sometimes without the direct help of a teacher. Play games with children for example sports Taking on kids for music lessons Hand washing lessons to kids and pupils Supervise kids during playing time especially break-time Love, Care and support to kids Story reading to pupils in primary one to Three. Train kids in basic hand washing

Requirements: Passion to work with children and slum communities Open minded and emotionally strong with ability to appreciate local settings Motivated volunteers but not necessarily qualified

Food: Depending on the accomodation chosen, the volunteer will share and cook meals with the family or prepare their own meals at the guest house.

Accommodation: Volunteers can stay at UPA Guest house. Possibility to arrange for host family. It is 5 kilometers from UPA to Good Mummy School, costing 12000 to and from using public means (Matatu). It cost approximately 15,000 with a hired motorcycle (Bodaboda).

Pocket money: None

Insurance: Not provided. Volunteer has to have his/her own insurance.

Fees: 500 EUR one time payment. Pick up from the airport/bus upon arrival in Uganda; orientation/training; accomodation; water; gas/electricity/charcoal; kitchen utensils; admin/communication; evaluation with host project. 500EUR for 1-3 months, 80EUR for each additional month.

The Clinic currently has a capacity of up to ten beds. It is registered by the Medical board council of Uganda with a practicing License.

Project Description:

Kiyita Family Alliance for Development (KIFAD) is a registered non-governmental organization, established in 2001. We concentrate mainly on increasing care and support to people infected and affected by HIV/AIDS in order to mitigate the effects of the epidemic. Besides that we aim at improving access to food among families/households, infected and affected by HIV/AIDS, as far as our financial means allows us to.

Work: * Mainly testing and counseling, depending on volunteer's interest/skills
* Fundraising for community activities * Monitoring and evaluation of projects

Project Description:

Mengo Youth Development Link (MYDEL) is a nongovernment organization based in Kampala, the capital city of Uganda. It was founded in 2001 as a slum youth initiative under the patronage of Mr. Pascal Lutaya. Following an early intervention approach, MYDEL focus their programs on the most vulnerable children and youths from the slum community, most of whom being school dropouts and orphans. MYDEL's mission is the empowerment of this target group through education, sensitization and skills development to contribute to a sustainable poverty reduction among these marginalized communities.

Work: * Teaching * Organizing, teaching and supervising in the computer class * Assisting in Counseling and psychosocial support * Vocational training (if the volunteers brings the skills) * Soccer program * Music, dance and drama * participating in community and home visits together with other staff, to see the life situation of the children living in the slums

Volunteers are supposed to be in the office at around 9.30am and work will finish at around 3.30pm (except during holidays). However, in some cases volunteers may be asked to work longer hours.

Requirements: MYDEL has different programs, it depends on the volunteer's skills and interest where to engage, there is room for new activities. Volunteers with social work skills but also other professions are very welcome, but no particular profession is required.
